I have worked as an art teacher in the British Columbia school system and given workshops in community centers and in the B.C. prisons. I am an active supporter of the arts, having been on the ECUAD Alumni Committee, an Active member of the FCA, and a member of the Surrey Art Gallery, The Seymour Art Gallery, the North Vancouver Community Art Gallery, the Port Moody Arts Center and the West Vancouver Community Arts Council.

The style I prefer to work in is somewhat impressionistic. I live in Kitsilano in Vancouver where I strive to improve my art – continuing to study with artists whose work interests me – most recently with Mike Svob, Eri Iishi, Susan Woolgar and Val Nelson.
